



CHILLING DISCOVERY: SHOPFRONT PAINTINGS RESEMBLE MISSING 7-YEAR-OLD



Eastwood detectives are investigating 28 stencil paintings on a Glebe shopfront. They chillingly resemble missing West Ryde boy Ian Stoker.

Twenty-eight coloured head shots, with "having fun is half the fun" written above in bright red paint have been spray-painted on the two-storey building in Glebe Point Road.

Some have been given a "Devilish-look" with pointed ears, beard and moustache.

The former shop is occupied by an elderly man who said, "I don't know who did it. If I did they would be in gaol."

Ian, seven, disappeared from his home in Station Street (West Ryde) on March 4 and was last seen by a school friend at a milk bar in Victoria Road.

Police are baffled by the case and the State Government has offered \$50,000 reward for information about his disappearance.
